

GENERAL PROVISIONS

hereinafter referr	ed to as the "GRANTEE".
Witnesseth That:	
1. Term of CON	TRACT. Except as may be set forth herein, this CONTRACT shall be effective as of, 2011, and shall terminate no later than March 7, 2013.

- 2. **Compliance with Existing Laws**. The GRANTEE, in order to induce the County to award this CONTRACT, agrees to comply with all Federal, State, County, and Municipal laws, rules, and regulations generally applicable to the activities in which the GRANTEE is engaged in the performance of the CONTRACT, including, but not limited to, the Local Public CONTRACTs Law.
- 3. **Termination and Suspension**. The following definitions shall apply for the purposes of this section:
 - A. Termination The termination of this CONTRACT means the cancellation of assistance, in whole or part, under this CONTRACT at any time prior to the date of completion.
 - B. Suspension The suspension of a CONTRACT is an action by the County which temporarily suspends assistance under the CONTRACT pending corrective action by the GRANTEE or pending a decision to terminate the CONTRACT by the County.
 - C. Disallowed Costs Disallowed costs are those charges which the County or its representatives determine to be beyond the scope of the purpose of this CONTRACT, excessive, or otherwise unallowable.
 - i. When the GRANTEE has failed to comply with CONTRACT stipulations, standards, or conditions, the County may suspend the CONTRACT and withhold further payments; prohibit the GRANTEE from incurring additional obligations of funds allocated hereunder pending corrective action by the GRANTEE; or decide to terminate the CONTRACT in accordance with paragraph ii below.
 - ii. The County may terminate the CONTRACT in whole, or in part whenever it is determined that the GRANTEE has failed to comply with the conditions of this CONTRACT. The County shall promptly notify the GRANTEE, in writing, of the determination and the reasons for the termination together with the effective date. Reasons may be one or more, but not limited to paragraphs (a) thru (h) listed below. Payments made to the GRANTEE or recoveries by the County under the CONTRACT terminated for cause shall be in accord with the legal rights and liability of the parties.
 - a) Utilization of any portion of the appropriation hereunder to employ or otherwise compensate any person employed by the COUNTY who has directly participated in the negotiation or approval of this CONTRACT;
 - b) Discovery of any pecuniary or personal interest by the GRANTEE, its employees, voluntary employees, its Officers, its Trustees, or its Directors in the Program, or in any CONTRACT emanating from the operation of this program;
 - c) Failure, for any reason of the GRANTEE to satisfy its obligations under this CONTRACT;

- d) Submission by the GRANTEE to the County of reports that are incorrect or incomplete in any material respect; if not amended within 10 Business Days;
- e) Any improper or inefficient use of funds, provided under the CONTRACT;
- f) Failure of the GRANTEE to permit the County of Bergen or its Designee to make an inspection of the administrative or operational facilities of the Program;
- g) Conduct or acts of the GRANTEE and/or its staff which are detrimental to the objectives of this Program;
- h) Any violation of the New Jersey Conflict of Interest Law, N. J. S. A. 52:13D 12 et seq.
- iii. The County may terminate the grant in whole, or in part, when the continuation of the project would not produce beneficial results commensurate with the further expenditure of funds. The GRANTEE shall not incur new obligations for the terminated portion after the effective date, and shall cancel as many outstanding obligations as possible.
- iv. In the event the funds required by the parties from local, State and Federal sources are not obtained and continued at an aggregate level sufficient to allow for the provision of the indicated quantity of service, the obligation of each party hereunder shall thereupon be reduced, or in the case of a complete failure of funds, terminated, provided that any termination of this CONTRACT shall be without prejudice to any obligations or liabilities of any party already accrued prior to such termination.
- v. If the COUNTY determines to terminate this CONTRACT for any of the aforementioned reasons, it shall promptly notify the GRANTEE in writing of the determination and the reasons for the termination together with the effective date. Before termination, the COUNTY may, in its sole discretion, allow the GRANTEE the opportunity to correct any non-compliance under this CONTRACT by notifying the GRANTEE that said non-compliance may be corrected within a time period specified by the COUNTY and that failure to correct non-compliance shall result in termination of this CONTRACT.
- vi. Upon termination of this CONTRACT, the GRANTEE shall forthwith return all unexpended proceeds of the grant to the COUNTY.
- 4. Retention of Records. The GRANTEE agrees to retain all records relevant to this CONTRACT and State and County auditors, and any other person duly authorized by the COUNTY, shall have full access to, and the right to examine, any of the said documents. Any claimed waiver of these rights or privileges must be documented in writing.
- 5. Funding Limitation. Funds available under this CONTRACT will be applied toward the specific activities enumerated in Attachment "A." It is understood and agreed the GRANTEE may not expend or obligate any amount in excess of the Total Approved Budget.
- 6. Method of Payment. The COUNTY shall make payments under this CONTRACT upon the submission of a properly executed County of Bergen Direct Voucher, together with such other documentation as may be required. The manner and form of such submissions shall be in accordance with the appropriate support documentation certifying work completed, and all other eligible reimbursable expenses.
- 7. Unexpended Fund Balances. The GRANTEE may incur costs only during the period set forth in paragraph No. 1 on page 3 of this CONTRACT. Expenditures made before or after these dates shall be disallowed. Any unexpended or unencumbered fund balance remaining shall be returned to the COUNTY within sixty (60) days from the termination of the CONTRACT. The COUNTY, at its discretion, may authorize the GRANTEE to use the unexpended grant funds.

In no event shall the GRANTEE use unexpended grant funds after the CONTRACT period without the express written approval of the COUNTY.

- 8. **Assignability.** The GRANTEE shall not subcontract any of the work or services by this CONTRACT, nor shall any interest in the CONTRACT be assigned or transferred, except as may be provided within the terms of this CONTRACT or the express written approval of the COUNTY.
- 9. **Insurance.** This CONTRACT shall not take effect and the GRANTEE shall not commence work under this CONTRACT until all insurance required hereunder and certificates of proof have been furnished to the COUNTY.

The GRANTEE shall indemnify and hold the County, its employees, representatives, and agents, harmless from any and all loss, liability or damage of any kind whatsoever, including but not limited to reasonable attorneys' fees and court costs arising out of or in any manner occasioned by breach by GRANTEE, its agents, employees, servants, or sub-GRANTEEs, of any covenant, term and/or condition of this CONTRACT, or by the negligence, improper conduct, intentional acts or omission of the GRANTEE, its agents, employees, servants or sub-GRANTEEs. The required amount of insurance is set forth as follows in Attachment "C" which is annexed hereto and made a part hereof.

10. Compliance.

- A. The GRANTEE, in order to induce the COUNTY to enter into this CONTRACT, agrees that it shall comply with all provisions of the authorizing appropriation, the act, and any requirements which the COUNTY may issue. It is further agreed that the GRANTEE shall seek its own source of funding in anticipation of the expiration of this CONTRACT. In no event shall this CONTRACT be construed as a commitment by the COUNTY to expend beyond the termination date set forth in paragraph 1 on page 3 of this CONTRACT.
- B. Narrative and statistical reports shall be provided as required.
- C. The GRANTEE agrees to maintain a comparison of outlays and budget amounts for each component of the Project, keep supporting documentation for all costs, and substantiate the reasonableness and allowability of all costs, among other requirements. The GRANTEE will designate a representative to be responsible for the administration of the Project and receive all communications from the County.
- 11. **Liability Statement.** The GRANTEE agrees to indemnify and hold the COUNTY, its employees, representatives, and agents harmless from any and all suits, claims and actions arising from or in the course of implementation of the Program including court costs and attorney's fees.
- 12. Monitoring, Auditing, Reporting and Evaluation.
 - A. The County shall monitor the management of the funds provided to the GRANTEE.
 - B. The COUNTY and the GRANTEE agree that Representative(s) of the County shall have the right to make onsite visits to the premises where public services are being provided pursuant to this CONTRACT and to inspect or audit the GRANTEE'S financial records at any time, upon reasonable notice.
- 13. **Other Funds.** The GRANTEE shall not use funds provided under this CONTRACT to replace existing or committed financial support for the same Program, except as may be provided by this CONTRACT or with the express written approval of the COUNTY.
- 14. **Time of Performance.** The services of the GRANTEE shall commence and terminate, as stated in Paragraph 1 on page 3.
- 15. **Amendments.** The COUNTY and/or the GRANTEE may, from time to time, require changes in the scope of services to be performed hereunder. Such changes which are mutually agreed upon by and between the COUNTY and the GRANTEE shall be incorporated in written amendments to this CONTRACT and signed by all parties.
- 16. **Program Cancellation.** The COUNTY reserves the right to cancel this CONTRACT effective immediately, and in such an event the COUNTY shall only be obligated for the payment under this agreement for services rendered or work performed prior to the effective date of cancellation, provided such monies are provided by the Federal and/or State government.

- 17. Obligations of GRANTEE with Respect to Certain Third Party Relationships. The GRANTEE shall remain fully obligated under the provisions of this CONTRACT notwithstanding its designation of any third party or parties for the undertaking of all or any part of the program with respect to which assistance is being provided to the GRANTEE pursuant to this CONTRACT. Any party which is not the GRANTEE shall comply with all lawful requirements of the GRANTEE necessary to insure that the program for which assistance is being provided under this CONTRACT is carried out in accordance with the GRANTEE'S assurances and certifications to the COUNTY.
- 18. Notices. All notices, demands, requests and other communications hereunder shall be deemed sufficient and properly given, if in writing and delivered in person to the following addresses (or such other or additional addresses provided by notice to the other Party) or sent by certified or registered mail, postage prepaid with return receipt requested at such addresses; provided if such, demand, requests or other communications are sent by mail, they shall be deemed as given on the third day following such mailing which is not a Saturday, Sunday or day on which United States mail is not delivered:

19. Use of Project.

- A. Open Space and Outdoor Recreation Purposes. The GRANTEE agrees to retain, protect, and use the Project for outdoor recreation purposes. Outdoor recreation purpose means the use of lands for open space parkland, outdoor active and/or passive recreation use. Usage shall be consistent with the policies of the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and Green Acres' rules and regulations.
- B. <u>Maintenance</u>. The GRANTEE has a duty at all times to maintain the Project in a manner that is consistent with the use of the Project set forth herein. The GRANTEE may utilize motorized vehicles in the management and maintenance of the Project.

20. Access.

- A. <u>Public Access</u>. Subject to the terms of this Agreement, the GRANTEE shall retain the exclusive right to use and access the Project. Although the public shall not accrue a general right to access and use the Project, the GRANTEE nevertheless covenants to permit public access to the greatest extent possible consistent with the uses stated herein.
- B. <u>Charges</u>. Any charges, fees and/or memberships in connection with public access shall comply with Green Acres' rules and regulations. Public vehicular access and parking areas shall be consistent with the permitted uses.
- 21. Responsibilities of County and GRANTEE not affected. Other than as specified herein, this CONTRACT is not intended to impose any legal or other responsibility on the County, or in any way to affect any existing obligations of the GRANTEE as owner of the Project. This shall apply to:
 - A. <u>Upkeep and Maintenance</u>. The GRANTEE, as owner of the property in which the Project is located, shall continue to be solely responsible for the upkeep and maintenance of the Project, to the extent it may be required by law. The County shall have no obligation for the upkeep or maintenance of the Project.
- 22. Prohibited Acts. Except for those rights expressly reserved, any activity on or use of the Project inconsistent with the purposes of this CONTRACT is prohibited. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the following activities and uses are expressly prohibited:
 - A. <u>Generally</u>. Any development of the Project for purposes other than outdoor recreation and its permitted support facilities as set forth herein is expressly prohibited.

23. Transfer of Project.

- A. <u>Bergen County Approval</u>. This park project is being improved or developed with funding from the Bergen County Open Space, Recreation Preservation, Farmland and Historic Preservation Trust Fund programs for the park and outdoor recreation activities set forth herein. The GRANTEE agrees, in perpetuity, not to lease, sell, exchange, remove, replace, donate, or dispose of the park improvement(s) in which the funded Park Improvement Project is described and located herein except upon approval by the County of Bergen or under such conditions as the County of Bergen may establish. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary GRANTEE shall not sell, lease, exchange, or donate the Project as described and located herein except to the State of New Jersey, a local government unit, or another qualifying tax-exempt, nonprofit organization. No such conveyance shall be effective without the prior written approval of the County.
- B. <u>Change of Use</u>. The GRANTEE shall have the right to change the outdoor recreation purpose or use for which the Project is being used to another outdoor recreation purpose or use in accordance with the terms of Green Acres Regulations, including, without limitation, N.J.A.C. 7:36-25.6, provided that the County consents to same in writing.
- 24. **Acknowledgement Sign.** The Grantee shall erect a sign, pursuant to the sign specifications provided by the County, acknowledging that the Bergen County Open Space, Recreation, Farmland and Historic Preservation Trust Fund assisted in the improvement or development of the Project. The sign shall be erected as soon as possible after the Project has been completed.

1. STATEMENT OF GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

The Township of Teaneck has played a special and unique role in the development and growth of suburban communities in the United States in the second half of the 20th century. From the honor of standing as the U.S. Army's Model Town of the United States in 1948 to the historic 1965 referendum that resulted in Teaneck becoming the first community in the United States to voluntarily bus students in order to racially integrate its schools. Teaneck has firmly established its status as a role model and a leader.

Now, in the early years of the 21st century, Teaneck continues to be a leading municipality – this time in the definition and design of the mature suburban community. With its small town quality and balance of land uses, Teaneck can increase opportunities for people to work and live within the Township and capitalize on the quality of life that attracts people to establish roots, build families and create lifelong friendships in the community. As such, the Planning Board has established the following Goals and Objectives upon which the Master Plan is based:

Goals:

- 1. Advance the purposes of the Municipal Land Use Law (MLUL) as contained in 40:55 D-2;
- 2. Preserve the character of existing low-density residential neighborhoods forming the predominant character of the Township;

- 3. Provide zoning protection for existing multifamily housing, and encourage its expansion only in areas where it would not have detrimental effects on single-family residential neighborhoods;
- 4. Provide a balanced land use pattern and appropriate development controls;
- 5. Guide appropriate development and growth in a coordinated and managed approach;
- 6. Strengthen the vitality of existing commercial districts;
- 7. Preserve, protect and enhance parks and open space while protecting environmentally sensitive, natural, and unique physical features at the same time;
- 8. Maintain the historic resources and natural beauty of our Township; and
- 9. Embrace, reflect and bring together the diverse sub-communities within the Township.

Objectives:

- 1. Ensure practical and appropriate development controls in order to preserve and protect open space, conserve the natural landscape and protect the sensitive ecological areas of the Township;
- 2. Protect neighborhood characteristics including the enforcement of buffer areas between non-residential and residential land uses, between different residential types, and along sensitive ecological areas of the Township;

- 3. Encourage the revitalization of vacant buildings and encourage the rehabilitation and restoration of brownfields and other contaminated buildings and land;
- 4. Maintain and upgrade the existing system of parks, recreation and open space to provide for Township residents of all ages, abilities and disabilities consistent with current and projected community needs for recreation and open space;
- 5. Preserve the high level of public services and encourage the creation of new facilities where necessary, in order to accommodate population changes, economic growth and the changing needs of residents;
- 6. Provide mechanisms to encourage the needed upgrade of the existing utility infrastructure including public water, stormwater management and wastewater treatment;
- 7. Provide for the Township's fair share of affordable housing as may be required by law as set forth in the Housing Plan Element;
- 8. Preserve and enhance the low-density residential character of established neighborhoods, maintain a reasonable balance of housing choices, and provide for in-fill development, adaptive reuse and affordable senior housing.
- 9. Promote historic preservation efforts that will maintain the Township's unique historic resources as designated;
- 10. Promote building and site improvements that have reasonable limitations on size, bulk, and site disturbance in relationship to the existing fabric of the community;

- 11. Encourage the development of a circulation system that accounts for roadways, mass transit, pedestrian/bicycle routes, greenway corridors and existing freight and goods movement facilities;
- 12. Coordinate land uses with transportation facilities, including but not limited to bus stops and parking for resident commuters to facilitate access and encourage alternatives to driving;
- 13. Promote a diversified economic base;
- 14. Focus economic development efforts on existing commercial, industrial and office districts and provide support and reinforcement to the four Business Districts to improve their viability;
- 15. Encourage the sharing of services with neighboring municipalities to lower Township operating and maintenance costs while maintaining or increasing their effectiveness; and
- 16. Support and promote public participation and awareness on Township Boards and commissions and awareness of all Township issues and initiatives.

Thus, the overarching goal of the Master Plan is to move forward while respecting and recognizing that all change is not bad and all growth is not good. Furthermore, the Township will strive to act with wisdom to maintain the position of leadership that it has held for over 100 years.

Planning for the future has been a tradition in Teaneck since 1931, when Teaneck became one of the first New Jersey municipalities to create a Planning Board in order to assume local control over the subdivision and mapping of land. The Master Plan is a formal document required by the State of New Jersey Municipal Land Use Law, and more importantly to Teaneck, it is a picture of the past and a vision for its future.

As provided for in the Municipal Land Use Law, the elements of the Teaneck Master Plan include: a Statement of Goals and Objectives, a Land Use Element, a Housing Element, a Circulation, Utilities, Community Facilities Elements; a Conservation, Recreation and Open Space Element; an Economic Plan Element, Historic Preservation Element, and a Recycling Element, as well as those elements' relationships to adjacent communities.
